



SITE NOTICE

WESTMEATH COUNTY COUNCIL

In accordance with the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended (Part XI) and Planning and Development Regulations 2001 – 2023 (Part 8), Westmeath County Council hereby state that this Authority proposes to carry out development as described below:-

Location of proposed development:

The works proposed are within the confines of the existing public roads of the Dublin Road (R446) and Tullamore Road in Kilbeggan, Co. Westmeath.

Nature and extent of proposed development:

To develop:

- a hard-surfaced shared footpath/cycling route, segregated from the vehicular carriageway, on the southern side of the Dublin Road (R446) approx. 520m in length;
- a footpath on the northern side of the Dublin Road (R446) approx. 520m ;
- alterations to the junction of the Dublin Road (R446) and the Tullamore Road (R389);
- associated alterations to the northern section and adjacent junctions on the Tullamore Road (R389) approx. 80m;
- provision of controlled crossing points; and
- the upgrading of Public Lighting along the route.

Submissions and observations with respect to the proposed development may be made via the Council's Consultation Portal at <https://consult.westmeathcoco.ie/en> or a written submissions or observations in relation to the proposed development, may also be submitted to **Planning Section, Westmeath County Council, Aras An Chontae, Mount Street, Mullingar, N91 FH4N** to arrive not later than 4.00pm on 28 August 2023.

A copy of the plans and particulars of the proposed development will also be available at Kilbeggan Branch Library during normal opening hours.

Written submissions or observations received will form part of a statutory report to be presented to a meeting of Westmeath County Council and will form part of a public document. The information contained in submissions may be available for public inspection, to be published on the Council's website and available at the Council's public counter. Details, including the names of those making submissions may be shared with relevant Council Departments or their agents involved in this Part 8 process.
